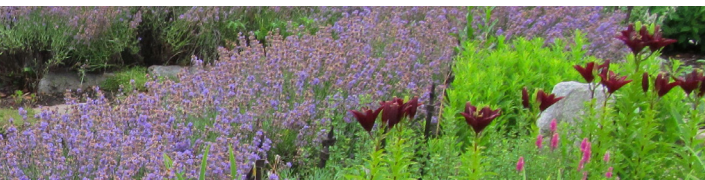
Kitchen Gardens - Today's Hottest Trend with a Historical Perspective
